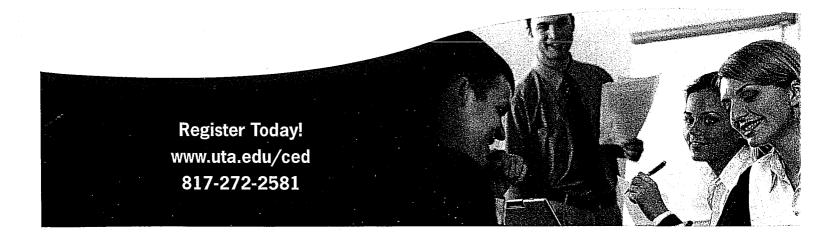

Event Planning for your Nonprofit (Elective)

This course is designed to provide you with instruction and beginning basics to develop the skills expected in the non-profit world. The course emphasizes the planning process from determining goals and objectives to follow-up evaluations and includes discussions on attracting sponsors for events.

Human Resources in Nonprofit Organizations (Required)

This course introduces students to the broad range of strategic and tactical processes and issues involved in managing a workforce. The course addresses issues common to all sectors (for-profit, nonprofit and public), including an overview of critical employment laws, recruitment and hiring, performance management, conflict resolution and resolving performance issues among other issues critical to effective human resource management. Participants will be afforded the opportunity to gain an understanding of the strategic and operational aspects of human resources management.
