"OUT OF BOX IDEA" - Green River Case

- Why Green River?
- Biggest serial murder case in U.S. History
- At least 48 Murdered Women
- 125 full-time detectives assigned
- 20,000 + suspects processed
- Over \$30 million spent on case
- Unprecedented press coverage
- Public pressure was overwhelming







MANHUNT LIVE GOES LIVE

- Wednesday December 7, 1988
- Show format / 1-800 line on screen
- 60 Detectives on set (26 + 34)
- Directors comments to Myrle –
 20 min before going "live"
- Teleprompter failure Opening
- Extend 1-800 line to December 13
- Chief Fitzsimons decision Unplug the 1-800 Hotline



MANHUNT LIVE RESULTS

- Estimated 100 Million Viewers watched
- Number of attempts to reach Hotline:
 124,000 + (April 6 13, 1988)
- 154 Stations carrying "Manhunt Live" throughout US, Canada & abroad
- Callers receiving busy signal: 57,000 +
- Callers who hung up phone after
 Detectives answered: 22,000 +

- Number completed calls with Detectives: 8,146
- Avg. time of calls with Detectives: 5.9 minutes
- Avg. daily attempts to reach Hotline: 115,000 +
- Avg. daily completed calls to Detectives: 1,248
- Reports given to Green River Task Force: 2,139
- Reports sent outside of Washington: 1,357

GREEN RIVER INVESTIGATION - 1982-1987

- Green River Investigation: from 1982-1987
- Largest serial murder case in U.S. History
- Over 110,000 pages of Detective notes
- King County Lead Detective Dave Reichert
- Finally a main suspect-Gary Leon Ridgway
- Commercial paint chips matched
- King Co. Prosecutor Norm Maleng decision
- Sentence was reduced to life without parole due to Ridgway's cooperation with recovery of additional missing victims



- Superior Court Nov. 5, 2003 Ridgway plead guilty
- Sentence: 48 life terms in prison!
- Finally....19 years of wondering is over!
